6. Participation/ Entry Fees:

Championship section: 6,000 yen

Youth Division: 4,000 yen

- \* If any participant joins both the Senior Championships (mixed team event) and the Youth Division, please pay the entry fee for the Senior Championships.
- \*\* The above competition entry fees do not include lunches or the fee for the party scheduled for Sunday, 16th July.

#### 7. Events:

A. Championship Division (Senior)

- \* Participants in this division must be at least 18 years of age (with the exception of the first three portions of the mixed team event which are open to players between 16 and 18 years old).
  - 1. Embu: Basic randori no kata (17 empty-handed techniques; kyu grades)
  - 2. Embu: Basic randori no kata (17 techniques against tanto; dan grades)
  - 3. Embu: Free kata (empty-handed; within 2 minutes)
  - 4. Embu: Koryu goshin no kata (16 empty-handed kneeling, hanzahandachi, and standing techniques)
  - 5. Mixed team event (7 people per team)
    - Koryu goshin no kata (8 empty-handed kneeling and hanzahandachi techniques; open to players from 16 years of age)
    - Koryu goshin no kata (8 empty-handed standing techniques; open to players from 16 years of age)
    - · Tanto taisabaki (Kyu grade players; open to players from 16 years of age regardless of gender)
      - · Women's tanto randori
      - · Men's tanto randori
  - 6. Women's individual tanto randori
  - 7. Men's individual tanto randori
  - 8. Women's team randori
  - 9. Men's team randori
- ※ In the embu section, participants may only enter a maximum of one event. If following the deadline, due to unavoidable circumstances or unforeseen health issues resulting in the cancellation of another participant, then a double entry (participation of one person in more than one embu event) may be requested, and this may be permitted only after the Executive Committee has determined that it is permissible.
- X Only one team per country may enter the mixed team event.

# B. Youth Division (Junior)

Up to 11 years old (U12)

- 10. Embu: Basic randori no kata (10 atemi and hiji waza)
- 11. Kakarigeiko (against tanto)
- 12. Ninindori (empty-handed; team of three)
- 13. Tanto taisabaki

#### C. Youth Division (Youth)

Between 12 and 15 years old (U16)

- 14. Embu: Basic randori no kata (17 techniques)
- 15. Embu: Free kata
- 16. Kakarigeiko (against tanto)
- 17. Ninindori (empty-handed; team of three)
- 18. Tanto taisabaki (female section)
- 19. Tanto taisabaki (male section)

#### D. Youth Division (Cadet)

Between 16 and 18 years old (U19)

- 20. Embu: Basic randori no kata (17 techniques)
- 21. Embu: Free kata
- 22. Kakarigeiko (against tanto)
- 23. Ninindori (empty-handed; team of three)
- 24. Tanto randori (female section)
- 25. Tanto randori (male section)
- ※ In the Youth Division (Junior/Youth/Cadet), participants may only enter a maximum of one embu event (open or basic) and a total of four events. Past the entry deadline, double entries (overlapping participation) may be permitted only after the Executive Committee has determined that it is unavoidable due to unforeseen health issues resulting in the cancellation of another participant.
- Whilst junior athletes may compete in the Youth events and youth athletes may enter the Cadet events, they are not permitted to participate in tanto events (taisabaki competition/randori competition) or embu events in both divisions.
- \* For the Youth Division, please enter your age as of Sunday, 16th July, 2023. For example, if your 12th birthday falls on 17th July, you may enter events in the Youth Division (Junior/U12).
